Upcoming meetings – there will be no regular meeting in November and December. Starting in January, we will start planning 2024 events, starting with the Big Horn Show in March. It was mentioned that we need to get the raffle tickets sooner so we have more time to sell them.

Fishing reports were given by several members:

Fall picnic – fishing was better on Sunday and later in the evening on Saturday. The week before, Chcuk had done well in 50 FOW on the east side of the river using a variety of smile blades and slow death hooks. Members discussed the variety of mylar and hard plastic wing style blades available and how they work at very slow speeds for different presentations.

Ken told he has been fishing above Lower Monumental in fairly shallow water during the hottest part of the summer and has been having good success.

Another member said they caught a few suspended near Jones Bay and the mouth of the Sanpoil River.

Hands on demonstrations on spinner and jig making will be held during the break before the guest speaker.

The monthly guest speaker was Mark Terrazas from the Spokane Tribal fisheries team. He gave a very informative talk about the tribes work on Lake Roosevelt. He said the tribe does not want to eradicate Walleye from the system but does not want Northern Pike to spread. Most of their work is in this area.
