Treasurer's Report

Checking Project Club Total \$1,118.14 \$10,563.71 \$8,979.80 \$20,661.65

\$1,735 has been received in membership renewals to date. Allan put a membership list on the table at the entrance tonight with delinquent members' names highlighted. He will send out a second reminder postcard the first of next month to those who still have not renewed their memberships. If not renewed after that, they will be dropped from the membership roll.

Our raffle has generated \$2,095 to date with expenses of \$1,923. As of the end of the Big Horn Show, we managed to come up \$45 short, which evidently was lost during the show. We will obviously have to improve our procedures for ticket sales and money handling at next year's show. \$20 was lost last year.

Since some of the prizes purchased for last year's raffle are included in this year's raffle, the total costs and revenues for both raffles will have to be combined for accurate assessments of both.
